2009 FEATURED SPEAKERS

Tom Crean

Indiana University

Coach Crean is a native of Mr. Pleasant Michigan. He earned a bachelor's degree in Parks and Recreation with a minor in Psychology. Crean got his start in coaching at the Division 1 level by serving on Jud Heathcoat's staff at Michigan State. He served in assistant positions at Pittsburgh and Western Kentucky before returning to Michigan State as an assistant to Tom Izzo. He became the head coach at Marquette University in 1999. In his nine years leading the Marquette program Cream's teams averaged over 20 wins a season and five NCAA tournament appearances including the 2003 "Final Four". In the process Crean has earned numerous National Coach of the Year awards. On April 2, 2008, Crean was named coach at Indiana University and began the task of rebuilding the proud Hoosier Tradition. Coach Crean is a tireless worker who expects the best and gets the most out of his players. He has a real passion for the game of basketball. He respects the tradition of IU Basketball and has embraced the challenge of restoring the program to national prominence.



Lin Dunn

Indiana Fever

Coach Lin Dunn has 525 wins as a college and professional coach. She is well chronicled as one of the nation's foremost pioneers of women's basketball and one of the most prominent coaches and leaders. Before joining the professional ranks, Dunn was probably best known for her coaching efforts at Purdue. During her nine seasons, 1988-9696, she led the Boilermakers to three Big 10 Championships, seven NCAA tournaments, four Sweet 16 appearances and a trip to the "Final Four" in 1994. On the national level she served on the USA basketball staff for the 1992 Olympics and 1990 gold medal winning World Championship and Goodwill Games. She was head coach of the 1995 bronze medal winning USA Jones Cup team and also served for eight years on the USA Basketball team selection committee. Coach Dunn has held various positions in the Fever organization and became the fourth Fever head coach in franchise history when she was named on December 12, 2007.



John Groce

Ohio University

The Danville, IN native began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his Alma Mater Taylor University. He helped the Trojans to a 29-5 record and a #1 national ranking in 1994. Coach broke into Division 1 basketball as a member of Herb Sendek's staff at N.C. State in 1996. He then joined Thad Matta's staff at Butler University, Xavier University, and Ohio State University where he helped lead the Buckeyes to the 2007 NCAA National Championship game and the 2008 NIT title.

In 2008, Coach Groce was recognized by both Fox Sports and Rivals.com as one of the nations top assistants. He has reached the post-season tournament 13 times in his 14 years on the collegiate sidelines. After more than a decade as an assistant or associate head coach, he spent the past season as head coach of the Ohio University Bobcats.



Chris Lowery

Southern Illinois University

Coach Lowery was a catalyst for the 1993 and 1994 SIU teams that reached the NCAA tournament. A scrappy hustling player, he still ranks among the school's career leaders in scoring, assists and steals. He returned to his Alma Mater as an assistant coach under Bruce Weber in 2002 during SIU's NCAA Sweet 16 Tournament run. Coach was named SIU head coach in 2004. In his first season, he led the Salukis to 27 wins, a MVC Conference regular season crown and became the youngest coach at age 32 to ever win the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year award. Under Coach Lowery's leadership, SIU has earned a reputation for playing outstanding man to man defense. CBS analyst Seth Davis was quoted "I've said for years that no school plays better fundamental man to man defense than Southern Illinois".

Billy Taylor

Ball State University

Coach Taylor is a 1995 graduate of Notre Dame and the Irish Mens' basketball team captain as a senior. He was an assistant coach at North Carolina – Greensboro and Notre Dame. In his first season as head coach in 2002-2003 at Lehigh, he guided the Mountain Hawks to the second largest turnaround in the nation, improving on the previous year's record by 11 wins. He was selected back to back Patriot League Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2004 becoming the first coach since Gonzaga's Mark Few to win conference coach of the year honors in each of his first two seasons as head coach.

Coach Taylor just completed his second season as Ball State's head coach. He and his staff are working very hard laying the foundation for the Cardinals program, a foundation that is rooted in four traits – character, commitment, mental toughness, and dedication.



2008—2009 BOYS' COACHES OF THE YEAR

Jason Ridge

District 1 - Northridge

Coach Ridge began his coaching career as an assistant at Wapahani High School under Coach Chris Benedict. He was an assistant at Columbia City High School from 1997-2003. His first head coaching position was at South Adams High School. While at South Adams, he had a record of 20-41. In 2006, he moved to Northridge High School where he has compiled a record of 46-19 over three seasons. He was the 2009 Northern Lakes Conference Coach of the Year after winning the first outright conference championship in school history. His Raiders went 20-0 during the regular season and became only the fifth team in Elkhart County history to go undefeated.



Marty Beasley

District 1 - Carroll (Allen)

Coach Beasley has just completed his 10th year as a varsity head coach. During the past four years at Carroll High School in Fort Wayne, he has led the Chargers to a sectional title in 2007 and has just completed back to back NHC conference Championships. His first six years as a head coach, he was at Garrett High School where his teams won two NECC conference championships, two NECC conference tournament championships, and a regional crown in 2004. Coach Beasley is a graduate of Columbia City High School (1989) and Taylor University (1993). He was an assistant at Hamilton Heights, Columbus East and Columbia City prior to becoming a head coach. The Chargers were 15-3 going into the state tournament.



Shaun Busick

District 2 - Zionsville

Coach Shaun Busick, a 1990 Grace College graduate, is in his third season as head man at Zionsville Community High School. The 2008-2009 season marked his 16 varsity season. Prior to his arrival at Zionsville, he had coaching stops at Argos, North Knox, Belmont and Crown Point. Coach Busick picked up his 200th career victory this season and his teams have won four conference championships, five sectionals, one regional and one semi-state. His Belmont Braves were the 3A State Runners-Up in 2004. At Zionsville, Coach Busick and his staff have put together a strong feeder program that extends down to the kindergarten level. He and his staff are actively involved year-round in developing a total program. Coach Busick and his wife, Cathleen, are both English teachers at Zionsville.



Craig Teagle

District 2 - Jay Co.

Craig Teagle is in his 11th year as head coach at Jay County High School. Coach Teagle has a 152 - 97 record in his 11 seasons with the Patriots. During Coach Teagle's tenure Jay County has won four sectionals and been an elite eight team twice. The also made a state championship runner-up appearance in 2006. Jay County has won 15 or more games six years in a row.



Tom Weeks

District 3 - Princeton

Coach Weeks is in his fourth season as the Tigers head coach. This season, the Tigers are 27-0 as they enter the semi-state. Weeks has an overall 61-37 win loss record.

Mike Saylor

District 3 - Terre Haute South

Coach Saylor is a graduate of Indiana State University where he played for former NCAA Division 1 Coach of the Year Bill Hodges and Indiana Basketball Hall of Famer Dave Schellhase. He was an assistant on Ron Green's ISU staff, coached at the Universidad Auto De Nuevo Leon in Monterrey Mexico and was an assistant to Hall of Fame Coach Pat Rady before being named the Head Coach at Terre Haute South in 2004. He has guided the Braves to a first ever 4 A Final Four appearance and has had three 18 plus winning seasons during the past five years. Heading into the sectionals the Braves are 18-3 and Coach Saylor is currently 74-46 as a head coach.



2008—2009 GIRLS' COACHES OF THE YEAR

Mark Redding

District 1 - Fort Wayne Elmhurst

Coach Redding was an assistant boys' and assistant girls' coach before becoming the head girls' coach at Fort Wayne Elmhurst in 1995. He holds a Bachelor and Master's degree in education from Indiana Wesleyan University and Indiana Purdue at Fort Wayne as well as a degree in finance and real estate from Indiana University. He led the Trojans to back to back Summit Athletic Conference Titles in 2008 and 2009, 3A sectional titles in 1999, 2003, back to back sectional titles in 2008-2009, and regional championships in 1999 and 2009, plus a 2009 semi-state crown and the 2009 3A state championship.



Steve Proctor

District 1 - Fairfield

Coach Proctor has been an Assistant Coach on the college and high school levels. He was also the Head Coach at Dodge City Community College for one season. For the past 5 years Coach Proctor has led the Falcons to a 78-37 record. This past season Fairfield was 21-6 and Sectional Champions.



Stan Benge

District 2 - Ben Davis

In his 24 seasons as head coach of the Ben Davis Lady Giants, Coach Benge has won 77 percent of his games (438-136). His Lady Giants have won seven Marion County titles, eight MIC Conference Championships, 20 Sectionals, 10 regionals, three semi states and back to back 4A State Championships in 2000 and 2001, as well as an undefeated 2009 state crown at 30-0. Coach Benge has won numerous Coach of the Year Awards and was previously IBCA District Coach of the Year in 1990 and 1992. This past season the Lady Giants have been nationally ranked #1 by USA Today.



Curt Benge

District 2 - Plainfield

Coach Benge has a BS degree from Marian College and earned his MS degree from Indiana Wesleyan. He just completed his 14th season as Coach of the Lady Quakers. During this time the Lady Quakers have won five Hendricks County Championships, seven Mid State Conference Championships, four Sectionals and one Regional championship. His overall won-loss record is 223-95. This past season the Lady Quakers were one of the most improved teams in the state, improving from a 12-11 record in 2007-08 to a 19-2 (4A), #5 ranking in 2008-09.



Jason Lane

District 3 - Vincennes Lincoln

Coach Lane has coached boys' and girls' elementary basketball and has been a boys' and girls' assistant at the high school level. For the past four seasons as varsity coach, Lane has led the Alices to a 65-27 record. The Alices were back to back sectional champions in 2008 and 2009 and a 2008 regional champion.

Coach Lane was selected ICGSA and HBCA District Coach of the Year in 2008. This past season the Alices finished the season 20-3 and were regional runner-up.



Mark Monroe

District 3 - Gibson Southern

Coach Monroe is a 1980 graduate of Indiana State University and earned his MS in 1985. He has just completed his 28th year of teaching and coaching in the South Gibson School Corporation. Coach Monroe coached eighth grade boys and JV boys before becoming the Varsity Girls' Coach. He has led the Titans to back to back sectional championships 2007-08-09. They were 2008-2009 PAC Conference Champions and the 2008-2009 Toyota Classic Champions. This season Coach Monroe led the Titans to a 22-2 record and they were regional runner-up.



VIRGIL SWEET DISTINGUISHED SERVICE AWARD RECIPIENTS

Each year the IBCA Board of Directors selects individuals from each of the three IBCA Districts to receive the Virgil Sweet Distinguished Service Award. The award, named in honor of longtime Executive Director of the IBCA, are given to individuals who have provided meritorious service in the promotion of basketball in the state of Indiana.

Bob Adams

District I

Bob is a graduate of Manchester College and Ball State University. He has covered Adams County sports and has been a sports writer for the Berne Tri Weekly news since 2001. Since 1996 he has written a column covering Indiana high School Basketball called "Below the Rim" and since 1998 he has been a sportscaster for WZBD-FM 92.7 broadcasting boys' and girls' basketball games, including numerous state finals.

For the past eight years he has co-hosted a sports show called "Hitzer Stoves High School Sports Weekly" which covers sports in Adams and Wells Counties. Bob has published three books; "Hoosier High School Basketball", Popcorn and Gym Shoes", and More Popcorn and Gym Shoes". The latter two are about old Indiana High School Gyms. He has just completed an Indiana High School Basketball CD that includes info on all boys' and girls' teams, coaches, records and much more. Greg Bell

District II

Greg is a native of Buffalo, New York and a graduate of Butler University with a BS in Radio and TV. He has covered high school sports in Grant and Shelby counties. He is currently the Sports Director at WIOU-WZVZ and has covered high school sports in Howard county for the past 25 years.

Greg has received the IHSAA Media Distinguished Service Award, Associated Press Top Play by Play Announcer Award and is a member of the state wrestling Hall of Fame. He has covered high school basketball for 33 years, calling over 1500 games. Thanks Greg, for your dedication to high school basketball during your career.



Bob Boyles

District III

Bob began his broadcasting career in 1964 at WKQV in Sullivan, covering the Golden Aces. From 1968-2008, Bob has broadcast around 3000 boys and girls sporting events, including 25 straight years at the boy's state finals from 1973-1998. During his forty years at WITZ Radio in Jasper, he has broadcast games for Jasper, Forest Park, Southridge (including their 1985 and 1986 tournament runs), Northeast Dubois and Loogootee (including their state tournament run in 1975).

Bob has also received the Marv Bates Award from the Indiana State Sportswriters and Sportscaster Association. From 1966-68, Bob served in the military, pulling duty in Thailand assisting media traveling from the United States to Southeast Asia to cover the war in Vietnam and Cambodia. Leigh is a graduate of Indiana State University and Castle High School. He has been a teacher for 19 years and coached his middle school teams to over 100 wins. District III

John is a graduate of Huntington High School and Huntington College. He was a sports writer in Huntington and Fort Wayne before joining the Bloomington Herald Times Sports Department where he has been the Executive Sports Editor since 1980. In 1980 John began supplying Jeff Sagarin with Indiana basketball and football scores for his rating system. In December of 2000, Harrell created JohnHarrell.net, a website devoted to Indiana High School football and basketball. John has edited numerous publications, including "Beyond the Brink with Indiana" (1987) and "Bob Hammel's Indiana Basketball" (1994). He has received the IHSAA Distinguished Media Service Award in 1995 and in 2006 he was inducted into the Indiana Sportswriter's and Broadcaster's Hall of Fame. Jeff Sagarin

District III

Jeff is a native of New Rochelle, NY and has been providing power ratings and player ratings to "USA Today" since 1985. He is mathematics' graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT- 1970) and earned an MBA from Indiana University in 1983. Sagarin has applied his unique ranking system to college football and basketball, major league baseball, the NFL, the NBA, NASCAR and several other sports. Since 1984, Sagarin has supplied the NCAA College Basketball selection committee, at its request, his latest ranking during the March Madness tournament selection process. In 1998 his football ratings became an official part of the Bowl Championship Series BCS team selection process. Since 1981, with the help of John Harrell of the Bloomington Herald-Times, he has been rating all Indiana High School football and basketball teams.

In 1957 as a fourth grader, Jeff read John R. Tunis great book "Yea Wildcats" about Indiana High School Basketball and has found it kind of a neat full circle to have ended up rating Indiana High School basketball teams for real during the past 28 years. 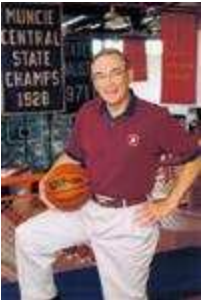

This article is being written before the 2009 Indiana High School Girls' Basketball State Finals are held at the Lucas Oil Stadium. The change in location is due to a conflict with the Big Ten Women's Tournament. The boys' high school championship games will continue to be held at the Conesco Fieldhouse. Over the years the finals have been played at numerous sites but this will be the biggest venue to ever host the girls' championship games. It will be interesting to observe the players' and fans' reaction to playing in such a massive structure.

Playing the championship games in such a massive facility causes one to recall the finals that were played in the Hoosier Dome in 1990. Hall of Famer Coach Dan Bush successfully guided the Bedford North Lawrence Stars through the tournament trail to capture the crown and cut down the nets in front of 40,046 delirious fans. Those in attendance were part of the largest crowd in the world to ever witness a high school basketball game.

Concord High School came into the finals ranked number one and undefeated. The Minutemen eked out 70-66 over the Anderson Indians in the first morning game. The second game was even more exciting as Bedford North Lawrence came back from a half time deficit to send the Southport Cardinals home by the score 58-55. In the championship game Concord was ahead 58-52 when the electrifying Damon Bailey took over and scored the last 11 points for the Stars. Bedford North Lawrence pulled out a 63-60 win.

Indiana high school basketball is long on heritage and tradition and those are the main reasons the only statewide high school basketball hall of fame in the nation is located in the Hoosier State. Basketball enthusiasts are encouraged to relive their high school memories and visit the Indiana High School Basketball Hall of Fame in the near future.

Athletic Director - Greenfield Central High School

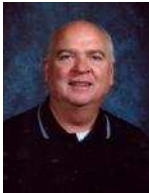
